Historic Royal Palaces

As you will know, the six palaces that HRP oversee have been closed since the end of March. However, the palaces are slowly starting to reopen.

The gardens at Hillsborough Castle (Northern Ireland) and Hampton Court Palace will be some of the first spaces to reopen, this Thursday 18th June 2020.

George is our new arrival at Hampton Court Palace. A rare grey Shire horse foal, he is one of fewer than 200 grey Shires in the world, and the first Shire born in London in living memory.

The history of Shire horses at Hampton Court goes all the way back to the reign of Henry VIII. In 1535 and 1540 Henry instigated two acts that governed the breeding of horses in England, with the aim of developing the ultimate war horse capable of carrying a man in heavy armour into battle.

George is growing in confidence every day, and both he and his mum Bess are doing really well. They are currently separated from the other horses to allow them plenty of quality time together, but in due course George will join the rest of the team and begin his training to become a working horse at the palace. In the meantime, George has got a LOT of growing to do!
