Dear Friends,

I am writing this right on the cusp of the announcement about which Tier we will be in. On the assumption that we are in Tier 2, church services will resume on the 6th December. At the moment, if the Tower is closed, then the chapels will also be closed.

Important. I am trying hard to gauge if we should have four members of the choir here on the 24th December for the 5pm Christmas Eve service. This puts pressure on Colm to find four choir members to sing (when like others, they will want to see their family) but there is also the expense. Please could you let me, or Debbie, know if you are thinking of coming to that service.

Cortland and I have been talking about this Government survey, if you have a moment please do respond to it. The Government is conducting a survey on the place in society of faith and faith communities. It is important that church people respond to this, not least because groups like the National Secular Society have mobilised their members to use it to make negative responses about faith in society (see: <u>Review to consider government's engagement with faith groups - National Secular Society (see also, for example, the website of the Humanists UK: Our campaigns » Humanists UK (humanism.org.uk).</u>

There is plenty of evidence of the positive value that the church provides to society as a whole and this has been especially evident during the Coronavirus pandemic. It is even possible to put a monetary value on this – see, for example: <u>Churches' \pounds 12.4 billion contribution to UK is under threat</u>, Archbishops warn (churchtimes.co.uk) . You can find plenty of stories about the significant contribution that the Church of England alone is making to relieve distress during the pandemic, such as: <u>Churches providing free meals for children amid half-term holiday hunger fears | The Church of England</u>. Synagogues, Sikh gurdwaras, mosques and Hindu temples all operate similar schemes. The various faith communities contribute a massive amount to society, just in material terms.

It is clear that faith communities are a fundamentally important element in social cohesion and good citizenship. The current Government survey is designed to harvest comments from individuals. It is important that all people of faith should respond, so that the Government can work with reliable and representative views of the majority and not just those of the noisy minority hostile to all forms of faith.
