Poem of the week

The sonnet *Ozymandias* seems very appropriate after this time of electioneering in the UK, and as we look ahead to elections in other places, such as the USA. (The name 'Ozymandias' is Greek for Ramses II, also known as Ramesses, who was an ancient Egyptian pharaoh who reigned in the 13th century BCE.) The poem, written in 1818, is about the discovery of a semi-destroyed statue of Ozymandias in the desert, and illustrates how civilisations and empires will also crumble as time changes everything, just as 'that colossal Wreck' of the once 'King of Kings' has decayed.

Percy Bysshe Shelley, one of the major English Romantic poets, was born in 1792 and lived a short life; he was only 29 when he died in a boating accident. He achieved no fame during his lifetime but recognition of his poetry, novels, essays and dramatic works grew steadily after his death. Shelley had visited the British Museum in 1817 with his friend, the poet Horace Smith, and suggested they each write a sonnet on the subject of Ramses II, under the title 'Ozymandias' as a friendly competition.

Shelley was a lifelong hater of any kind of tyranny, as can be seen in the poem. I would suggest that this is a poem that really needs to be read aloud to get the full meaning. I also believe that many of those currently seeking power would do well to dwell on its powerful message.

Ozymandias

I met a traveller from an antique land, Who said—"Two vast and trunkless legs of stone Stand in the desert...... Near them, on the sand, Half sunk a shattered visage lies, whose frown, And wrinkled lip, and sneer of cold command, Tell that its sculptor well those passions read Which yet survive, stamped on these lifeless things, The hand that mocked them, and the heart that fed;

And on the pedestal, these words appear: My name is Ozymandias, King of Kings; Look on my Works, ye Mighty, and despair! Nothing beside remains. Round the decay Of that colossal Wreck, boundless and bare The lone and level sands stretch far away."
