Dear friends,

This coming Sunday is the Saints' Day known as *St Michael and All Angels*. This particular festival doesn't often fall on a Sunday, so it's a great opportunity for us to make something special of it. St Michael is an Archangel (one of three) who is leader of heaven's armies and defeater of Lucifer, or the devil. This festival, sometimes referred to as Michaelmas tide, is associated with a number of traditions.

One which I particularly like has its origins on the Isle of Skye, where a procession is held, led by people holding Michaelmas daisies. There is an old saying, in the west of Ireland and elsewhere, that 'If you eat a goose on Michaelmas Day, you will never lack money any a day'. If only that were true!





This festival is one of the oldest in the Christian calendar and started with the dedication of a church in Rome to St Michael in the 5th century. It may well be that the name Michael, which is Hebrew in origin and means 'who is like God' or 'gift from God', led to the popularity of the name ever since.

St Michael is also the patron saint of soldiers, marines and paratroopers.

Poem of the week

As you would expect, given all this discussion about angels, I couldn't resist the opportunity to choose a poem on the subject; and what better than William Blake's famous and evocative poem *The Angel*! It was published in 1794 as part of his collection *Songs of Experience* and, as the scholar Wiliam Andrew has commented, 'It speaks of the fascinating concept of angels. The idea of the angel is common within the Abrahamic religions (Islam, Christianity, Judaism and Bahá'í), as well as being mentioned in Sikh and Zoroastrian texts. The idea of having a guardian angel is one that is thousands of years old, and in each form of the phrase, there are core similarities: that an angel is a spiritual, otherworldly being charged with the benevolent task of fulfilling the will of the Divine on Earth'.

Our Congregation


On Saturday 21st September, Tim and Meg were married in the Chapel of St Peter ad Vincula.

and following the link which then pops up. If you are eligible for Gift Aid, please tick the relevant box and provide the required details on the CAF Bank online form. These two links are also available on our website **here**.

DIRECT DEBIT. It is also possible to use the links above to set up a Direct Debit if that is what you prefer.

If you are an eligible UK taxpayer using the CAF Bank website via the links above to make either a one-off donation or to set up a Direct Debit, please remember to tick the Gift Aid box on the CAF site form. This method of Gift Aid payment does entail some delay in our receiving the benefit – hence our preference for Standing Orders. Gift Aid is available only to eligible UK taxpayers.
