And so, we come the end of another liturgical year, as Advent Sunday (December 1st) will mark the start of a new year. In Advent, we prepare our hearts and minds for the birth of Christ at Christmas. Some of our preparation will be joyful but, as with any new birth, there will also be apprehension, particularly since this new birth, more than any other, is life-changing. John's Gospel speaks of Jesus' birth as the coming of the light (John 1: 2) without which nothing can live, but also in which nothing can hide. Light is symbolic of all that God is: it is life, it is truth, it is warmth; it is active and it pushes away the darkness. Advent is a time to let the light in, to allow it to challenge us and dispel the darkness.

Almighty God, creator of light, give us courage to turn to you with hope and trust. As we await the birth of your son, Jesus Christ, may the renewing Spirit teach us to trust your purposes of love, and to allow the new birth to set us free. Amen.

Collect for Advent Sunday

Almighty God, give us grace that we may cast away the works of darkness, and put upon us the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which thy Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility: that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious Majesty, to judge both the quick and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal, through him who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Ghost, now and ever. Poem of the week

'Infant Sorrow', written by William Blake is part of his *Songs of Experience* collection, which forms a counterpart with the poems in *Songs of Innocence*. The two collections were originally published separately but in 1794, Blake combined both sets into a single illustrated volume entitled *Songs of Innocence and of Experience Shewing the Two Contrary States of the Human Soul*. 'Infant Sorrow', the poem I have chosen, contrasts with 'Infant Joy' in *Songs of Innocence*, which describes a child who is only two days old and perceived to be happy and joyful. In 'Infant Sorrow', however, the helpless naked child has a will of his own, is capable of defying both parents and is highly aware of the dangerous world he has entered. We could say he has entered the world of *experience*. Blake himself was something of a troublesome child, who hated discipline and, as a result, was sent off to boarding school. This little poem has often come to mind as I've held a child at baptism, or cradled my own children at the time of their birth, wondering what the future hold for them, and what God's plan might be for them. Sometimes these things can turn out very differently from what we expect.

Infant Sorrow


My mother groan'd! my father wept. Into the dangerous world I leapt: Helpless, naked, piping loud; Like a fiend hid in a cloud.

DIRECT DEBIT. It is also possible to use the links above to set up a Direct Debit if that is what you prefer.

If you are an eligible UK taxpayer using the CAF Bank website via the links above to make either a oneoff donation or to set up a Direct Debit, please remember to tick the Gift Aid box on the CAF site form. This method of Gift Aid payment does entail some delay in our receiving the benefit – hence our preference for Standing Orders. Gift Aid is available only to eligible UK taxpayers.
