Dear friends.

It is with great sadness that I'm writing to tell you that my wife Barbara died on Saturday. As many of you will know, she was diagnosed with oesophageal cancer last April. Throughout the last year I never once heard her complain or show any sign of bitterness, and she dealt with the cancer in her own courageous way. Since Christmas she had been very poorly, and spent the last few days in St Thomas' Hospital before finally dying in St Joseph's Hospice, where she wanted to end her days. I have been so lucky to have our three children, Beth, Harriet and Richard here, who, along with me, have been at her side throughout this last part of her life. Barbara had no fear of dying; she just wanted to die pain-free and comfortably, surrounded by the people who loved her.

I am very grateful to everyone who has supported us, enabled me to be with Barbara, and given me the space to do so.

There will a family service at the crematorium later this month, and then, in the summer, a service of thanksgiving with beautiful music, readings and reflections on Barbara's life.

Music

Ego flos campi - Clemens non Papa (c.1510-1555)

This motet is one of the most ravishing of the entire Renaissance. It is thought to have been written for the Illustrious Brotherhood of Our Blessed Lady in 's-Hertogenbosch while Clemens was working for them for a 3-month period in 1550. The motto of the Brotherhood was 'Sicut lillium inter spinas' (As a lily among thorns), a reference to the purity of the Virgin Mary amidst a world of sinners. This text, and the additional words of Clemens' motet, is taken from the *Song of Songs*. The music is in seven parts, another nod to Mary as seven is a Marion number. The florid contrapuntal writing is beautifully expressive and second to none in the Renaissance. In the middle of the motet the music breaks into homophony (where all the singers are singing the same text at the same time) at the text 'Sicut lillium inter spinas': Clemens uses the Brotherhood's motto as the central point of the piece, first in the high voices, then the low voices and finally the whole choir.

Ego flos campi et lilium convallium. Sicut lilium inter spinas sic amica mea inter filias. Fons hortorum et puteus aquarum viventium quae fluunt impetu de Libano.

Which run with a strong stream from Lebanon.
