Breaking bread together around the altar and afterwards drinking coffee together strengthens our fellowship one with another.

Over many years we have supported various charities, for example, The Tower Hamlets Food Bank and more recently, the London Hygiene Bank. I'm very grateful for all your support. We will continue to support both these charities by means of a donation, but I have decided that we will stop collecting for the London Hygiene Bank and, when St Peter's reopens, we will support another charity. As part of our stewardship, we also give away £3,000 each year to various other charities, in line with all the chapels within the Chapels Royal. In addition, we respond to national disaster appeals and to the Bishop's Lent appeal.

All this is possible through your generous support of the chapel, for which I thank you.

News on the Chapel refurbishment

I'm pleased to report that, to date, everything continues to be on time. Work on the mobility entrance outside the west door has now reached an important moment. You may recall that several years ago, exploratory excavations outside the west door revealed two skeletal remains. The digging has now reached that same level, and everybody is hoping that nothing similar is found. We shall see!



Inside the chapel the damp, especially along the south wall, is being dealt with, and work in the crypt is under way.



The Bishop of London (as Dean of the Chapels Royal) was here this week, and I was able to give her an update on the progress.

Prayer of the week

The Jesus Prayer 'Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me'

The Jesus Prayer is sometimes referred to as an 'Arrow Prayer' just like the prayer '*Maranatha*, Come, *Lord Jesus*.' Its origins probably lie with the Desert Fathers (monks in the Egyptian desert in the 5th century), although the two sinners in Matthew's Gospel, chapter 20, cry out in a similar way. Ten words in English and seven in Greek, this short sentence is remarkably complete: there is the cry for mercy, the discipline of repetition, a quest for silence and veneration of the name of Jesus.

When the disciples asked Jesus to teach them to pray, Christ gave them the Lord's Prayer, beloved by Christians for centuries and used daily in church and when Christians are alone or meet together. The Jesus Prayer has been a source of great help in difficult times; the tradition of slow invocation or repetition, when all else seems to fail, has been a gift to the church.

Try sitting in a quiet spot - this can be anywhere - and then slowly repeat the Jesus Prayer, perhaps five times, building up to ten times. This might well be something you could try each day throughout Lent, which begins in a few weeks' time.

<u>Music</u>

Kyrie (from Missa Tu es Petrus) - Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina (c.1525-1594)

Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina is regarded as one of the greatest composers of the Renaissance. This year we celebrate the 500th anniversary of his birth and you can expect to hear lots of his music when we are back in Chapel. Palestrina's style is known for its purity, beauty of melodic shape and graceful treatment of dissonance. This Kyrie (from his Missa Tu es Petrus) is a vigorous work based on his motet of the same name (Thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church). The blocks of sound one experiences are perhaps depicting the strength of the early church, both the body of people as well the bricks and mortar. In this Kyrie Palestrina pits the upper voices against the lower voices throughout, but this tension does not deflect from the overall joyousness and optimism of this glorious music.
