And now for something very serious. I keep in touch with the Anglican Cathedral in Jerusalem, which I have visited on a number of occasions. The following message was sent to many supporters by the Dean of the Cathedral, and I commend it to you.

Richard Sewell, the Dean of St George's College in Jerusalem, is inviting people to join him in fasting, in solidarity with the people of Gaza, every Wednesday, beginning on 21st May. Please consider joining Richard by fasting in whatever way you can, whether by skipping a meal or eating less, or by using the time to pray for food and aid supplies to get into the region and meet the needs of those who are suffering so terribly. (Please, however, be sensible in fasting, doing only as much as you can manage and following medical advice where necessary.) If you do join in, you can share what you're doing on social media by using the hashtag **#fastforgaza**.



### Poem of the week



William Stafford was an American poet and pacifist. He took his BA and later his MA at the University of Kansas and in 1954 completed a PhD at the University of Iowa. He had been drafted into the armed forces in 1941 but declared himself a pacifist and, as a registered conscientious objector, worked between 1942 and 1946 in forestry and soil conservation work. It wasn't until he was 48 and had already been teaching in several different academic institutions that his first collection of poetry, *Travelling through the Dark*, was published. It won the National Book Award for poetry in 1963. Stafford's poetry is often short, uncomplicated and tends to focus on the details relating to a specific locality. He composed nearly 22,000 poems, of which about 3,000 were published.

This short poem, *Ask Me*, poses questions in the first stanza and offers answers in the second. It reflects on those who have helped and hindered us in life and explores the interconnectedness of past actions and present experiences through the metaphor of a river. The river seems to me to be a good analogy of life: sometimes frozen, allowing time for stillness and contemplation, and sometimes running, carrying the speaker forward, shallow in some places and deeper in others. Listening to each other, looking and waiting suggest a willingness to find meaning in the continuous flow of life with the people whom we encounter.

#### Ask Me

Some time when the river is ice ask me mistakes I have made. Ask me whether what I have done is my life. Others have come in their slow way into my thought, and some have tried to help or to hurt: ask me what difference their strongest love or hate has made.

I will listen to what you say. You and I can turn and look at the silent river and wait. We know the current is there, hidden; and there are comings and goings from miles away that hold the stillness exactly before us. What the river says, that is what I say.

Holy Communion at 11am and the last service before the summer break.



James Leith Macbeth Bain was a healer, mystic, and poet known as Brother James. He founded the Brotherhood of Healers, and he and his fellow healers often sang to their patients during healing sessions. Reputedly, melodies came to him spontaneously and this is perhaps the most famous. It sets the words of Psalm 23 and is sung here in an arrangement for 4-part choir by Gordon Jacobs.

**DIRECT DEBIT.** It is also possible to use the links above to set up a Direct Debit if that is what you prefer.

If you are an eligible UK taxpayer using the CAF Bank website via the links above to make either a oneoff donation or to set up a Direct Debit, please remember to tick the Gift Aid box on the CAF site form. This method of Gift Aid payment does entail some delay in our receiving the benefit – hence our preference for Standing Orders. Gift Aid is available only to eligible UK taxpayers.
