## A prayer for the summer holidays

St Augustine (354 – 430 AD), often referred to as St Augustine of Hippo, was the bishop of Hippo Regius in Numidia, Roman North Africa. He was a theologian and philosopher and one of the great Fathers of the Church. His writings deeply influenced the development of Western Christianity and are still a source of inspiration and learning to this day; his book *The City of God* is considered to be one of the great classics of the early church. St Augustine was also renowned for his piety and his prayers, one of which I have chosen for this week's Newsletter.

This prayer, which has the idea of service at its very heart, reminds us that as Christ came to serve us, so we are to serve Christ's people everywhere. The way we respond to poverty, cruelty and injustice in the world must come from within us and be the very essence of our being and our instincts.

It's a beautiful prayer, worth learning and allowing to take root in our hearts, as we respond to the challenging world in which we live.

### **Prayer of St Augustine**

O thou, who art the light of the minds that know thee,

the life of the souls that love thee

and the strength of the wills that serve thee;

help us so to know thee that we may truly love thee;

so to love thee that we may fully serve thee,

whom to serve is perfect freedom. Amen.

and following the link which then pops up. If you are eligible for Gift Aid, please tick the relevant box and provide the required details on the CAF Bank online form. These two links are also available on our website <u>here</u>.

**DIRECT DEBIT.** It is also possible to use the links above to set up a Direct Debit if that is what you prefer.

If you are an eligible UK taxpayer using the CAF Bank website via the links above to make either a oneoff donation or to set up a Direct Debit, please remember to tick the Gift Aid box on the CAF site form. This method of Gift Aid payment does entail some delay in our receiving the benefit – hence our preference for Standing Orders. Gift Aid is available only to eligible UK taxpayers.
