

The Chapels Royal of St Peter ad Vincula and St John the Evangelist HM Tower of London

Dear friends,

The week of the 30th October marks the start of two festivals: **All Saints' Day** (on 1st November) and **All Souls' Day** (on 2nd November).

In many churches, All Saints' Day is often translated to the nearest Sunday, and we are doing that on Sunday 29th October. The service for All Souls' Day will be at 1900hrs in the White Tower on 2nd November. If you would like someone remembered then, do give Debbie or me the name.

Over the years I have made a number of visits to the Holy Land. In July 2017 we made a chapel pilgrimage to the Holy Land, visiting Jerusalem, Bethlehem, Galilee and other important Christian sites, as well as Nablus and other sites on the West Bank. The awful events of the last few weeks: the dreadful terrorist attacks by Hamas in Israel on 7th October, the loss of life in Gaza, and the explosion at the Anglican Al-Ahli Hospital, described by Archbishop Naoum in Jerusalem as 'a dreadful and devastating massacre' have made us all weep. Many of us, myself included, feel utterly hopeless, and wonder what we can do. One thing we are asked to do, and, moreover, to do with earnest good will, is to pray, pray and pray for an end to the bloodshed and for the restoration of peace in the Holy Land and neighbouring territories. As Christians we are asked to be living stones built into a holy temple in Christ. This is the time for our prayers to move stone and mountain, that peace would come in the Middle East for all people, Jews, Muslims and Christians.

On Wednesday I attended the funeral of Paul Abram, my predecessor here at the Tower. It was a memorable occasion, very well attended, with excellent addresses and a moving service that expressed profound hope in the Resurrection.

Poem of the week

Denise Levertov was born in Ilford in 1923 and died in Seattle in 1997. Her mother, Beatrice, came from North Wales, while her father, Paul Philip Levertoff, was born in 1878 in what is now Belarus. He came from a strict Jewish Hasidic family, but while studying in Germany, came across a copy of the Gospels translated into Hebrew and subsequently converted to Christianity. He met Beatrice in Constantinople in 1910 where he was working as a missionary and she was teaching at a mission school. They married in 1911 and lived in Warsaw until the outbreak of the First World War, when Paul was placed under house arrest as a Russian enemy alien for the duration of hostilities. After the war, Beatrice persuaded Paul to return with her to North Wales, while he prepared for ordination as an Anglican, and was then sent to a parish in Shoreditch. Denise, who was educated at home, decided to be a writer at the age of five, and when she was 12, sent some of her poems to TS Eliot, who replied with encouraging advice. Her first poem was published when she was 17 and her first book six years later. She married an American writer, moved to the USA and became a professor of English at several universities, becoming an American citizen in 1955. Her poetry included themes of politics, opposition to the Vietnam war and, later, religion. I have chosen here an excerpt from her 1961 poem *Matins*.

From Matins

Stir the holy grains, set the bowls on the table and call the child to eat.

While we eat we think, as we think an undercurrent of dream runs through us faster than thought towards recognition.

Call the child to eat, send him off, his mouth tasting of toothpaste, to go down into the ground, into the roaring train and to school.

His cheeks are pink his black eyes hold his dreams, he has left forgetting his glasses.

> Follow down the stairs at a clatter to give them to him and save his sight.

Cold air comes in at the street door.
