Poem of the week

This week I have chosen a poem by Leo Marks; born in 1920, he died in January 2001. He was a screenwriter, cryptographer and poet. Marks wrote an account of his experiences during WW2 called *'Between Silk and Cyanide: A Codemaker's Story 1941-1945'*.

On this day, the 11^{th of} July 1940, (as I write this Newsletter), Marshal Philippe Pétain became head of the collaborationist regime of Vichy France, despite General de Gaulle's appeal to the people of France, the previous month, to resist the rule of the Germans. Pétain was sentenced to death for treason after the war, a sentence which was commuted to life imprisonment on the Île d'Yeu, where he subsequently died in 1951.

Leo Marks, when working as a cryptographer for the Special Operations Executive (SOE) in London, nurtured a passion for Ruth, the goddaughter of Sir Charles Hambro, the executive head of SOE. Marks wrote this poem after she was killed in an air crash in Canada and later gave it as a *code poem* to the Franco-British agent Violette Szabo for her to use when encoding her messages. She was parachuted into France on June 7th, 1944, to co-ordinate the work of the French Resistance after D-Day, but was captured and handed over to the Gestapo in Paris for interrogation. Violette Szabo was then sent to Ravensbrück women's concentration camp, where she was executed in January 1945, at the age of 23. She was posthumously awarded the George Cross. The poem '*The Life That I Have*' was used in '*Carve Her Name with Pride*', the film about her life.

This poem always moves me, especially after my time as an army chaplain, and is one that I have used at the funerals of a number of soldiers killed in action.

Code Poem for the French Resistance (also called The Life That I Have).

The life that I have Is all that I have And the life that I have Is yours

The love that I have Of the life that I have Is yours and yours and yours.

A sleep I shall have A rest I shall have Yet death will be but a pause For the peace of my years In the long green grass Will be yours and yours.
