

During the Second World War, John Pudney was commissioned into the Royal Air Force as an intelligence officer and as a member of the Air Ministry's Creative Writers Unit. '*For Johnny*' became one of the war's most popular poems in England and was broadcast and performed by several famous actors, including Sir Laurence Olivier. It features in the 1945 British war film *The Way to the Stars*, which was distributed in the United States as *Johnny in the Clouds*.
