#### Poem of the week

Charles Baudelaire was born in France in 1821 and, as well as being a noted poet, was also an essayist and art critic. He remains an important and prominent poet in French literature. It is thought that he may have seen an albatross when his father sent him on a voyage to Réunion, an island in the Indian Ocean, in 1841. The poem, translated here by Roy Campbell, uses the metaphor of an albatross, wantonly maltreated by sailors, to express Baudelaire's concern for the fate of the poet, or of anyone with a sensitive temperament, who feels a sense of separateness and alienation in a hostile society which cruelly mocks him. It's a sad poem, but one to savour and think about.

#### The Albatross

Sometimes for sport the men of loafing crews Snare the great albatrosses of the deep, The indolent companions of their cruise As through the bitter vastitudes they sweep.

Scarce have they fished abroad these airy kings When helpless on such unaccustomed floors, They piteously droop their huge white wings And trail them at their side like drifting oars.

How comical, how ugly, and how meek Appears this soarer of celestial snows! One, with his pipe, teases the golden beak, One, limping, mocks the cripple as he goes.

The poet, like this monarch of the clouds, Despising archers, rides the storm elate. But, stranded on the earth to jeering crowds, The great wings of the giant baulk his gait.

## The Royal Foundation of St Katharine in Limehouse - Candlemas Light and Sound Installation

Tower of London community are especially welcome to come to a special event at St Katharine's. **Sun 29th January – 6.30pm – 9.30pm** 

Come and see the buildings and grounds of The Royal Foundation of St Katharine and Yurt Cafe immersed in a unique artistic light projection accompanied by ambient DJ soundscapes.

The installation curated by artists Heena Song and Julian Hand will offer an exceptional interpretation of the Feast of Candlemas. Our impressive venues will host a selection of projections and music specially designed and produced for this event. There will be a ten-minute meditation each hour in the chapel on the theme.

Candlemas, also known as the Feast of the Presentation, is one of the oldest feasts of the Christian church and is a Christian holiday commemorating the ritual presentation of the baby Jesus to God in the Temple. On Candlemas, Christians would traditionally bring their candles to their local church, where they are blessed and then used for the rest of the year. For Christians, these candles serve as a symbol of Jesus Christ, the Light of the World. In pre-Christian times, it was the festival of light and marked the midpoint of winter, halfway between the winter solstice and the spring equinox.

The artists will be live performing a combination of liquid light-based, analogue and digital visuals. The sites will be lit with an assortment of projectors employing various techniques and art forms ranging from classic liquid light, optokinetic projectors and experimental films to analogue video feedback projection techniques.

The Yurt Café will be open during the evening serving drinks and food.
