

The Chapels Royal of St Peter ad Vincula and St John the Evangelist

Dear friends,



This Thursday, February 2nd, is Candlemas or The Presentation of Christ in the Temple, marking the end of the season of Christmas and Epiphany. The scene is depicted in Rembrandt's painting of 1669 (in the National Museum of Stockholm) and was created in the year the painter died, at the age of 63. (Rembrandt had already painted more than one earlier depiction of the scene, perhaps the best-known being that painted in 1631, when he was 25. This painting is a much wider composition, showing all the characters, the wider busyness of the Temple and also its architecture.)

However, in the 1669 painting, shown here, the view is far more intimate and focused. It is likely to have been one of the last paintings the artist was working on at the end of his life, and remained unfinished. The focus is on the aged Simeon who has been waiting faithfully all his life for the Messiah, the hope of all Israel. Here, the Messiah is revealed as a tiny child in his arms. Simeon's hands are together in prayer and we sense that his eyesight is already dim. It is a beautiful moment of wonder, awe, fulfilment and hope for the future. Two reflections come to my mind. Firstly, I wonder what both the painting and Candlemas tell you about waiting and hope? Secondly, I wonder where you see God's promises being fulfilled today? With my best wishes, thoughts and prayers for you all, Roger.

Poem of the week

Robert Frost was the most widely admired and highly honoured American poet of the 20th century. He is perhaps best known for the poem below, as well as his poem *The Gift Outright*, which was recited at the inauguration of President John F. Kennedy in 1961. *The Road Not Taken* is another much-loved poem. Frost liked to write about the outdoors and especially about rural life in New England in the early 20th century. He received four Pulitzer Prizes for Poetry during his lifetime, as well as other awards, and was awarded the Congressional Gold Medal in 1960 for his literary work. I like this poem very much; its atmosphere speaks of winter and pilgrimage.

Stopping by the Woods on a Snowy Evening

Whose woods these are I think I know.

His house is in the village though;

He will not see me stopping here

To watch his woods fill up with snow.

My little horse must think it queer

To stop without a farmhouse near

Between the woods and frozen lake

The darkest evening of the year.

He gives his harness bells a shake To ask if there is some mistake. The only other sound's the sweep Of easy wind and downy flake.

The woods are lovely, dark, and deep, And I have promises to keep, And miles to go before I sleep, And miles to go before I sleep.
