Poem of the week

Gillian Allnutt is an English poet, author of nine collections and the recipient of several prizes, including the 2016 Queen's Gold Medal for Poetry. Her poems are often quite short and quite spare. In this poem, written in 2004, we are in Durham Cathedral's Galilee Chapel, where St Bede (also known as The Venerable Bede) and St Cuthbert are buried. There are several possible interpretations of the poem, where the verger is described carefully polishing the floor where the police officer and the voyeur are walking, as we step into this holy place. The air closing over the angel's departure alludes to the everpresent sense of holiness in the Cathedral. The river and light move together, surrounding the Cathedral and making it into a place of the heart, where light and grace meet. Read the poem slowly and savour its meaning for you.

Careful, here, as polishing cloth across a floor, police officer, voyeur.

Air closes over the angel's departure Always, in the air. The river in the floor

inhabits it, as light inhabits water or the heart's interior or here.


